

Celebration Mystery Quilt-Along

Part 4

Welcome to Part 4 of *Quilt Street's* Celebration Mystery Quilt-Along! This installment provides instructions for making large Flying Geese Units using a stitch-and-flip technique.

Once you're done with this part of the pattern, all that's left will be to assemble the blocks and stitch them together to make the quilt top. So if you haven't downloaded Parts 1–3 yet, now's the time! Follow along with instructor Krista Moser in the free Celebration quilt-along videos to see her demonstrate how to make all of the units and for her bonus piecing tips and tricks.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

Read through entire pattern before beginning project. Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances with fabric right sides together. Pressing arrows are included with illustrations. Fabric requirements include extra yardage for shrinkage and insurance. If working with directional prints, you may want to begin with more fabric than called for.

WOF = width of fabric

CUTTING:

From Fabric E, cut:

- (6) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Cut strips into:
 - (24) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

From Fabric F, cut:

- (6) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Cut strips into:
 - (48) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

UNIT ASSEMBLY:

1 Referring to **Diagram 1**, draw a diagonal line on wrong side of (2) **Fabric F** $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Place 1 marked square on one end of **Fabric E** $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle as shown. Sew on drawn line and trim away excess fabric with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Repeat on opposite end of rectangle to make **Flying Geese Unit**. Make 24.

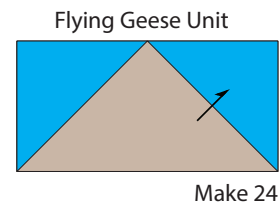
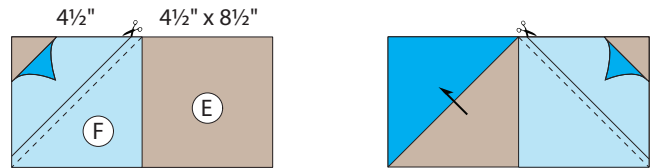
